5/16/24 At my meeting with the highway crew we discussed a number of different ways to reduce cost. We All agreed to do a cost comparison between a couple of existing suppliers and for example Amazon. Based on the analysis that the highway guys submitted the savings are anywhere from 20%-over 100%. We will be discussing a new purchasing plan at our May meeting.

5/20/24 I met with Judy Hall (Cohocton Supervisor), Jeanette, and Angela to discuss payment structure from the Terra-Gen Project. We all agreed, including the Supervisor from Howard, who could not attend, that we would propose a new formula to the I.D.A. for the distribution of Host Community Agreement and Pilot. We all want the majority of the town's share to be paid to the Host Community Agreement (HCA) not the pilot. The HCA monies go into the general fund of the town which can be used for basically any town expenses. The PILOT can only be used in the town tax levy. 6/3/24 We received an email from Mary Barthelme regarding the Main Street Project. With regard to the Main Street Grant the project is to be completed by November 2024. A meeting will be set to discuss the current status of the project.

6/6/24 I met with Matt Bull this morning to update Prattsburgh's grant application with E.F.C. (Environmental Facilities Corporation). The E.F.C. can provide a low interest rate loan for the Wastewater Project if Prattsburgh is selected. Along with this we will be applying for the W.Q.I.P. (Water Quality Improvement Program) grant by the end of July. We applied last year but were not chosen. This grant is a New York State grant that we need to supplement the Federal grants that we have been awarded.

6/10/24 Chris Whipple, Pete Scheid, and I had a conference call with Mary Barthelme from New York State Homes and Community Renewal (Main Street Grant). The state was looking for an update on the Main Street Project. We told them that the Costanza's did not agree with a number of things that Larson Design Group had put is their report and were now appealing to New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Boards of Review.

6/12/24 We have been informed that the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code Board of Review has scheduled a hearing on July 18th for the Main Street Project. The decision from the State Department will be the final determination. The public is encouraged to attend. The meeting will probably be accessed through Webex and as soon as that is available, we will pass it along.

Angela Einwachter gave The Town Board a quick report on behalf of The Planning Board and discussed a potential Moratorium for solar projects.
